Description: MERCE Family Healthcare is currently recruiting an energetic, team-oriented bilingual individual to serve as an interpreter between MERCE employees, or medical staff and patients requiring Spanish interpretation services.

This position provides services in a variety of clinical settings for patients with diverse backgrounds and must possess excellent Spanish and English oral language skills along with the ability to read and write in English and Spanish. This position provides medical interpretation services to MERCE's diverse patient population who come from various economic backgrounds. Excellent interpersonal skills and a desire to work in a health care/human service setting are a must.

Requirements: Interpretation (Spanish/English) experience required; medical terminology required. One-two years' experience in a medical setting highly preferred.

The Practice: MERCE Family Healthcare has been operating since 1992 as a private, non-profit organization. MERCE was designated a Federally Qualified Health Center in 2007. Operation hours at the medical facility are Monday through Thursday 8:00am – 5:00pm and Friday 8:00am – 12:00pm.

Our medical staff cares for a variety of patients within the entire family practice spectrum. Our patient mix includes self-pay as well as Medicare, Medicaid and those with private insurance. Call is telephone only; no hospital call required.

The Community: Asheboro/Randolph County, NC is a part of the Piedmont Triad region, a six-county area whose central location puts it within 90 miles of the Blue Ridge Mountains to the west and within 200 miles of the Atlantic Ocean to the east. Asheboro sits in the middle of the Eastern Seaboard, within 500 miles of half of the nation's population and largest markets. The region is united by the Piedmont Triad International Airport, interstate highways, a score of colleges and universities, and a rich cultural life. Asheboro is convenient to Greensboro, Winston-Salem, Chapel Hill and Burlington.
